SECTION 2 Partnerships Developing Partnerships

Developing partnerships in your community where a youth count will occur is instrumental to a successful count. It is a key strategy used to recruit volunteers. Partnering organizations offer unique knowledge about the youth they serve and may provide new strategies to help count youth and improve their participation in a count. Research from previous youth counts show that partnerships and relationships built during a youth count yields long term benefits too, like sustained collaboration among youth groups and increasing community capacity to better serve young people experiencing homelessness.¹

When identifying organizations or groups to work with consider the following recommendations:

TIP:

Community Resource Coordination Groups (CRCG) are local interagency groups, comprised of public and private health and human service providers who come together to develop individual services plans for children, youth, and adults whose needs can be met only through interagency coordination and cooperation. There are approximately 160 CRCGs available to all 254 Texas counties. Contacting your local CRCG is an opportunity to notify multiple service providers in your area about *Youth Count Texas!* and identify potential partners. TIP:

Services to At-Risk Youth (STAR) is a statewide program. The STAR program contracts with community agencies to offer family crisis intervention counseling, short-term emergency respite care, and individual and family counseling. Youth up to age 17 and their families are eligible if they are dealing with conflict at home, truancy or delinquency, or have a youth who runs away from home. STAR services are available in all Texas counties. Contacting the STAR provider in your area may help you to identify partners and recruit volunteers for *Youth Count Texas!*.
